Burn permit applications are available as a fill-in form.

TO: Agricultural Burn Permit Applicant
FROM: Yolo-Solano Air Quality Management District
RE: Agricultural Burn Permits

An agricultural burning permit issued pursuant to District Rule 4.2 will be valid from January 1 through December 31 of the calendar year in which it is issued. The permit is valid for use in any fire district located within the Yolo-Solano AQMD. Prior approval is required before burning any type of material.

As of January 2009, the District will only be collecting the base fee of \$30. At the end of each calendar year, the actual amount burned (by type of crop) will be invoiced to the permit holder. There is a worksheet with these instructions to assist in the calculation of what will be owed once burning is done for the calendar year.

We will then issue and mail your copy of the validated permit.

Failure to adhere to these instructions may cause a delay in receiving your agricultural burn permit. The permit is not valid until signed by District personnel and base fee has been paid. Both the base fee invoice and year end acreage invoice needs to be paid within 30 days of receiving the invoices.

The burning of orchard prunings can be conducted using the District's agricultural burn line voice mail system, if the message indicates it is a burn day for orchard prunings. The following information should be included in your message for orchard prunings: Name on permit, phone number (preferably a cell phone), location of burn, fire district, number of acres from which the material being burned (today) was generated from, orchard type and burn permit number.

**YOLO-SOLANO AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT
RULE 4.2 PERMIT FEES - AGRICULTURAL BURNING**

REVISED April 10, 1996
EFFECTIVE January 1, 1997

This Rule applies to any person who conducts or allows to be conducted on property under his control open burning for agricultural operations, range improvement, wildlife habitat improvement and/or wildland vegetation management.

No person shall open burn or authorize the open burning of agricultural crop waste or conduct any range or wildlife habitat, or wildland improvement burning without first obtaining a valid Agricultural Burning Permit from the Air Quality Management District and paying the annual fees.

Base Fee: Each agricultural burn permit shall be subject to a base fee pursuant to Section 41512.5 of the California Health & Safety Code and additional fees as indicated below.	\$30.00*	Must be paid to receive a valid permit

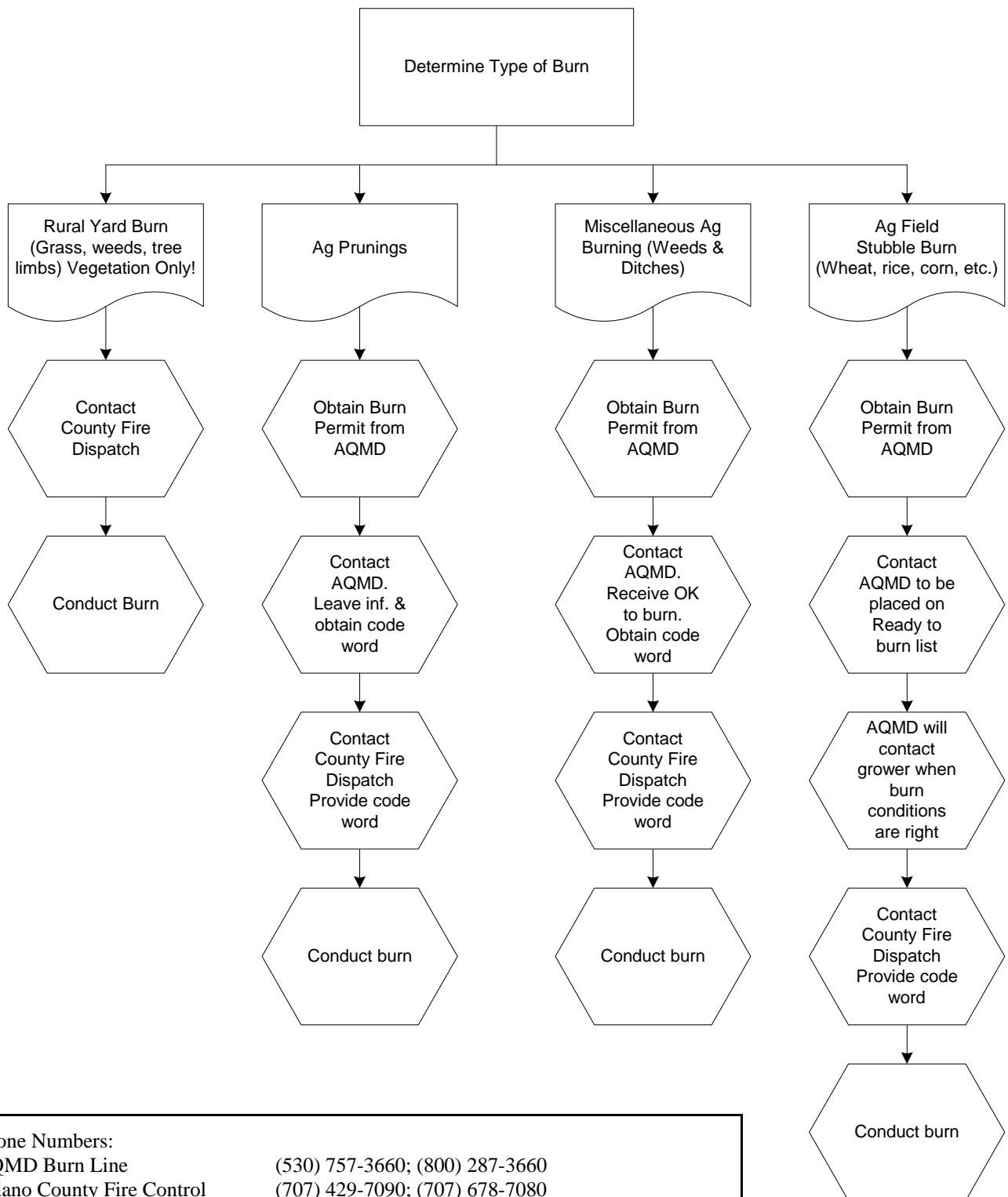
This is for your information only. You will be invoiced at the end of the calendar year in which the your permit was issued for actual acreage burned.

Field Crop Stubble: Including, but not limited to wheat, corn, safflower, oats, and barley; also includes roadways, fencelines, irrigation ditches and field borders.	\$1.25 per acre
Rice Stubble: Field includes costs for administration of the Rice Straw Burning Phasedown Regulation; also includes roadways, fencelines, irrigation ditches and field borders.	\$1.50 per acre
Orchard Prunings: Including roadways, fencelines, irrigation ditches and field borders.	85¢ per acre
Miscellaneous Burning: Including, but not limited to reclamation district levees, wildland vegetation management burning, range management burning, pastures, or fallow fields that are not subject to field crop stubble, rice stubble or orchard prunings as listed above. Also includes roadways, fencelines, irrigation ditches and field borders.	\$1.00 per acre

Wildland vegetation management burning on land owned by the State of California or the federal government shall be exempted from the requirements of this Rule.

*The above fee includes the cost imposed by the Sacramento Valley Basinwide Air Pollution Control Council at \$5.00 per permit issued.

**BURNING IN CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY AND FIRE
PROTECTION (CDF) STATE RESPONSIBILITY LANDS
(SRA LANDS)**

Persons wanting to conduct open burns must have approval and a permit to conduct burns during the declared fire season. The declared fire season usually runs from May 1st through December 1st.

The following fire districts require a burn permit from their agency before burning in SRA lands:

Vacaville Fire Protection District

Vacaville Rural Fire Protection District

Winters Fire Protection District

The following fire districts require a burn permit from CDF before burning in SRA lands:

Madison Fire Protection District

Esparto Fire Protection District

Capay Valley Fire Protection District

Dunnigan Fire Protection District
