### **\$10 Million Available for Alternative Fuel Infrastructure**

Up to 10 million dollars is now available to help local businesses and organizations make the switch to zero- or near-zero-emission vehicles. Funded through the Carl Moyer and Community Air Protection Incentive Programs, incentives can be used for battery electric vehicle charging stations and natural gas and hydrogen fueling stations.

“In our region, mobile sources account for the majority of air pollution,” said Mat Ehrhardt, Air Pollution Control Officer for the Yolo-Solo Air Quality Management District. “Increasing access to alternative fueling will reduce the number of people impacted by poor air quality in our communities.”

#### **Who can apply?**

- Businesses, non-profits, and public agencies are encouraged to apply.
- Charging or fueling stations must be located in Sacramento County, Yolo County and portions of Solano County (within the Yolo-Solano Air Quality Management District).
- Funding priority will be given to projects in disadvantaged communities as identified by [CalEnvrioScreen 3.0](#) as well as areas identified under the AB617 Community Air Protection Program.

#### **How to apply?**

- Most applications will be approved on a first-come, first-served basis.
