Applications Open for District's Clean Air Funds, 2025 Solicitation

The Yolo-Solano Air Quality Management District is now accepting applications for nearly \$3 million in funding to reduce emissions across the region. Through the District's Clean Air Funds program and its 2025 Solicitation for grant funding, financial support is available for projects focused on clean vehicle upgrades, alternative transportation, and public education.

Applications for Clean Air Funds are available **here**. There is \$439,000 available for projects in the District. The application deadline for Clean Air Funds projects is 4 p.m. April 18.

Applications for the 2025 Solicitation for grant funding are available here. The District has more than \$2.3 million available in funding for the 2025 Solicitation through the Carl Moyer, Community Air Protection (CAP) Incentives, Targeted Airshed Grant (TAG), and AB 923 Programs. The application deadline for the 2025 Solicitation is 4 p.m. May 2.


to Deputy Air Pollution Control Officer, succeeding Paul Hensleigh after his retirement in December.

Spare the Air Season Starts May 1

To help reduce the number of high-smog days, Spare The Air alerts are called when air pollution is



forecasted to be high between May and October. On Spare The Air Days, please drive less. This could mean taking public transit, carpooling, biking, walking or telecommuting.

May is Bike Month, too, which is a perfect opportunity to swap the car for a bike and reduce emissions as well as win prizes for miles logged.

During the 2024-25 DLT season, the Air District issued 18 Don't Light Tonight advisories. This annual program runs from November 1 through the end of February each year when common weather conditions and the elevated use of fireplaces and woodstoves raise the levels of fine particulate pollution (commonly called soot) in our air. To help reduce peak soot levels and protect the public health, the Air District runs an annual program called Don't Light Tonight that asks residents to refrain from wood burning on days that typical winter weather conditions contribute to an increase in particle pollution



(PM2.5) closer to ground level. For the 20204-2025 season, observed air quality in the District was in the Good AQI category on 32 percent of days, the Moderate AQI category on 67 percent of days, and the Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups (USG) category on 1 percent of days.
